PCMC unveils its Timeless Treasures

The Philippine Children's Medical Center (PCMC) celebrated the release of its new book Timeless Treasures during its soft launch event on April 27, 2023, as part of the weeklong celebration of the hospital's 43rd Anniversary.

The 90-page coffee table book features more than 100 photographs of artworks, old furniture, and fixtures that are still present and used to be available inside the medical center.

PCMC Executive Director Dr. Sonia B. Gonzalez said the book aims "to capture the beauty of PCMC's living art and make known the reasons behind why it was called a Wonderland for Children."

The PCMC, formerly known as "Lungsod ng Kabataan", was an oasis for patients because of the eye-catching murals, educational walls and ceiling designs, artistic nurse stations and patient beds, and life-sized fruits turned into benches and an information desk. As the years passed, these gorgeous and educational artworks were subjected to wear and tear due to hospital-wide repairs and construction.

The "Lungsod ng Kabataan" was created in 1979 through Presidential Decree 1631. It was inaugurated on April 29, 1980, in the

presence of Her Royal Highness Princess Margaret of the United Kingdom. Under the then-Minister of Human Settlements, First Lady Imelda R. Marcos, the hospital started delivering expert healthcare to children on June 23, 1980.

In November 1986, Malacañang issued Memorandum Order No. 48, renaming the hospital the Philippine Children's Medical Center, or PCMC.

As the first alumna of the PCMC Residency and Fellowship Training Program who became the executive director of the institution, Dr. Gonzalez was one of the people who witnessed the beauty and uniqueness of the hospital.

As a fitting tribute to these historical figures, she decided to come up of a coffee table book consisting of all these artworks and old furniture for everyone to see, especially the future generations, the treasures of PCMC which are considered timeless.

The furniture and other fixtures of the hospital reflected the resiliency and ingenuity of this specialty center which used materials naturally found in the country. These timeless pieces have been functional in the executive offices for the past 43 years.

The Scientific Committee for the 43rd PCMC Anniversary Celebration was given the task of complementing the annual activities, which serve not only to celebrate but also sustain and preserve the spirit and vitality of the institution.

This year, the initial kickoff was providential as it coincided with World Immunization Week. Both on a global and national scale, the disruption of delivery and access to health services as an offshoot of the pandemic has greatly impacted immunization coverage rates, leaving a lot of children vulnerable to vaccine-preventable diseases.

The brief town hall meeting that was held on May 26, 2023, was the perfect avenue to reinforce the value of vaccination and the need to catch up. Following the rule of three (3), key core messages were shared. First, vaccination saves lives. Second, vaccines save money, and third, vaccines protect those who are vulnerable.

In promoting a safe and healthy environment, participants were also shown the number of employees vaccinated and the number of patients served. At the end of the program, a call to support the Department of Health's supplemental immunization activity in May was also made.

PCMC is quite fortunate to be able to provide vaccines beyond the expanded program of immunization. This is proof of the institution's commitment to champion primary prevention.

On this note, the Committee fully intends not only to promote immunization but to embark on several activities that would provide possibilities for self-improvement, such as maximizing educational opportunities and rehabilitation ergonomics, to name a few.
